TESTIMONY

At Nadege, I found the affection I needed. I found everything I needed. So, I wondered if it was really me who was becoming capable of putting into words everything I had suffered. I started to congratulate myself. The psychologist helped me a lot. She was always available and willing to help me even outside of her working days. She always supported me when I was discouraged. She was always there for me. At one point I had suicidal thoughts, the psychologist gave me beneficial advice. Which I hadn't really received before. Now I have completed all phases of the Nadege program. I'm getting ready to leave the Safe House.

2023 SUCCESS STORIES

In 2023, we explored new fundraising opportunities by creating greeting card bundles. Volunteers created artwork related to Mother's Day, and we used their images to design a pack of greeting cards.

Art was a major focus of our work in 2023. After our Mother's Day campaign, we invited residents to join in the fundraising journey by creating art, which we then turned into greeting cards as well.

Our Giving Tuesday Campaign this year focused on Marie Hays' enthusiasm for friendship bracelets.

Our biggest success story from 2023 was the graduation of another survivor from our program.




